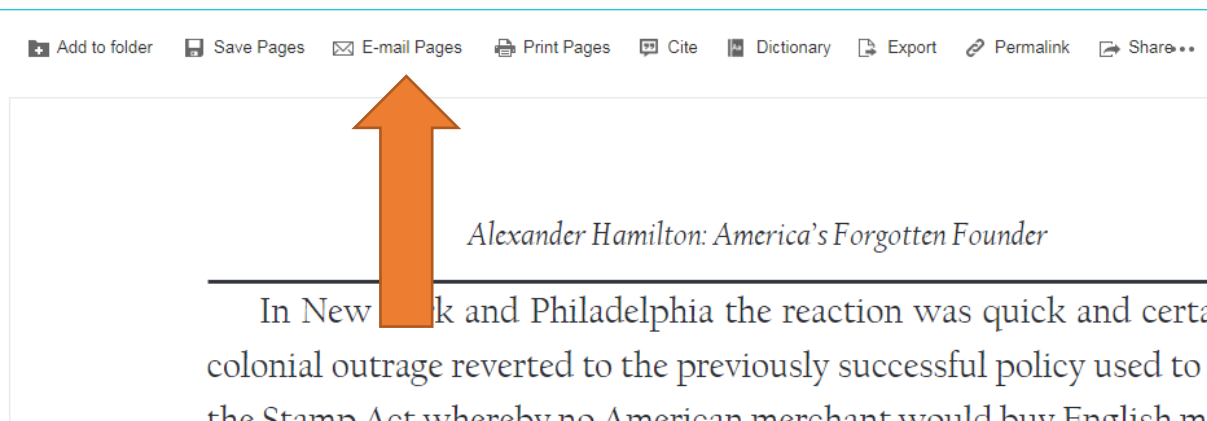

Here you will have the option to send your current page and onwards. It is also possible to select **“This selection”**, meaning the current chapter that you’ve navigated to.

The number of pages you have available to save will vary from book to book.

Type in the email address you want the excerpt sent to and select **E-mail PDF**:
